Remote Learning

In current circumstances, it is important that as a school we can offer quality and accessible remote learning for children to complete at home in the event that they cannot attend school due to the Covid situation. If children are well but needing to stay home to isolate or due to bubble/school closure, we want to ensure learning at home can continue smoothly and in a way that enables children to continue to access their curriculum. We will teach the same cu

In this booklet we have included some important information of how learning at home can be accessed. The systems explained in here is at an individual level, should your child need to isolate and but it is also noted how this will look at a group level should a bubble or the school need to close.

What will remote Learning look like at Birdsedge First School?

1. See Saw

We are using a great online platform called 'Seesaw' to share daily lessons for children. This will ensure that all learning is accessible from one place, children can complete activities and tasks online in the platform and receive feedback from their teacher all from the same place. This will remove the need to receive work over email and print worksheets at home. There is a video guide and step by step booklet on our school website which explains clearly how the platform works and how to navigate around it. Daily Lessons and work set through see-saw will be in the following formats:

- Recordings of lessons, tutorials or models from teachers
- Interactive powerpoints with voiceovers explaining learning or a concept
- Videos of lessons led by expert practitioners from supporting platforms
- Worksheets, questions and activities to complete

2. Teams Live Lesson

There will be a short, regular face to face check in via video call using Teams for your child when they are not in school. This is to check they are ok with the learning set on see-saw, have a chance to ask any questions and to generally stay in touch with their teacher. For Individual children isolating we will do this as much as possible from school.

In the case of a bubble/school closure this will be done as a whole class with all children daily for a 'Live Lesson' where children will watch their teacher, may have models shared on the screen and be able to interact and contribute. The live lessons will be at set times each day and timetabled to best support families in case of sharing a device or the need for adult support to access fully. Teachers will also offer daily additional follow up lessons for any children needing any 'keep up' support for the learning set that day.

3. Assemblies

Assemblies have been an important part of developing our whole school culture and ethos this school year and we want to ensure this continues as much as possible remotely. Assemblies will be recorded and uploaded to see saw regularly for children to watch. This will be every Monday and Friday with additional ones for national events or news provided as appropriate.

4. Forest Friday

Children have loved more opportunities for learning outside this term and we want to continue to provide outdoor learning opportunities, safely, for remote learning too. A weekly Forest Friday activity will be shared through the recorded assembly and posted on see saw for families to join in with if they wish and are able to.

5. Children with Special Educational Needs or Disability

For children with an additional need, who would normally have access to further support or intervention in school, we will ensure that provision is appropriately differentiated, interventions shared with parents and cares where appropriate and arrange additional 1:1 time with an adult from school via Teams. This will be set up personalised to each individual child's needs.

Timetables and Coverage

We expect that remote education (including remote teaching and independent work) will take pupils broadly the following number of hours each day, this is to meet government requirements for each age group of children

Key Stage 1	Minimum requirement for children in Key Stage 1 is 3 Hours per Day
Key Stage 2	Minimum Requirement for children in Key Stage 2 is 4 Hours per Day
